Annual General Meeting

It was great to see everyone who attended our AGM, held on 2nd July at Harpenden Trust Centre.

It was a joyful and informative event, with so many people actively taking part in the meeting. Here's a potted summary:



Introductions

Our Chair, Peter Taylor introduced proceedings, including an update on recent developments, services and finances, as well as plans for fundraising and a new capital campaign in the year ahead.

Financial Summary

While the accounts reported the previous financial year ended with a deficit, indications are that the financial year just ended will result in a balanced budget.

Financial Summary (Continued)

Further good news is the achievement of an additional reserve pot of restricted funds to support specific future developments. We recognised the need to raise income in response to the increase in employer National Insurance contributions. Planned fundraising activity will support a budgeted £120,000 voluntary income this year.

Platinum Plan

A five year 'Platinum' Plan was shared including:

- Building a culture of continuous improvement
- Investment in property for sustainability
- · Growth of life-long learning
- Launch of a capital fundraising appeal
- Expansion of services to reach more people who need our support



We talked about plans to redevelop Stairways, working with a local Housing Association. We're currently agreeing Heads of Terms and hope to soon appoint an architect so we can submit a scheme for planning permission. Our vision is to offer a greater range of high quality accommodation, to an increased number of people. A capital fundraising appeal could:

- Support the redevelopment of Stairways
- Enable purchase of property in Batford
- Fund major repairs and renovations at Pine Court



We're so grateful to everyone who came and shared their thoughts about this year's highlights, activities and developments. From pottery painting at Britannia Club to the warm and cosy feel of new homes in Batford, we were especially proud of our tenants who shared their views and our volunteers who talked about what Harpenden Mencap means to them. Thank you.
