The group of eight – six friends and two Support Workers – stayed in two lodges at Parkdean Resorts at Warmwell, just a fifteen-minute drive from the seafront at Weymouth.

They hired a minibus to get around and enjoyed a vast array of activities. These included a boat trip, visiting Portland Bill Lighthouse where some of them climbed all the way to the top, and travelling around the coast.

“It was really exciting setting off on the minibus. It was just nice to be with my friends.” Alison says.



The energetic adventurers also tried dry slope skiing and visited Weymouth tank museum – this was one of the group's favourite parts of the holiday, hearing about military history.

"We learned a lot about local and military history," Heather recalls. "And about Weymouth's man-made sea defence."

One day, they boarded a steam train from Corfe Castle to Swanage. They also spent time in Weymouth, gazing out across the seafront, exploring the tropical gardens, and soaking up the wildlife and atmosphere at the town's famous swannery.



"The Swanage-Corfe Castle rail journey and visiting the swannery were my favourite parts of the holiday," Penny says. "It was also lovely just seeing the sea."

The friends' days were long and fun-filled. "We were out from 9am to around 6pm each day, and were out again in the evenings for dinner," Heather explains.
